

RULES AND PLAYING ARRANGEMENTS

GENERAL

The Rules and Playing Arrangements set out below apply to all Divisions of the Shropshire Cricket League and will continue in force until officially amended on the authority of the Management Committee of the League.

These Rules are binding on all players and clubs in the Shropshire Cricket League and the Management Committee may take action against defaulting clubs or players.

The subscription shall be £19.00 per team, to be paid to the Treasurer not later than 1st May, by Direct Debit or Standing Order if possible. (See also Rule 15.1.)

2. QUALIFICATION OF PLAYERS

- 2.1 All players in Shropshire Cricket League matches must be registered with the League.
- 2.2 A list of playing members from whom teams for the current season will be selected, must be submitted to the Registrations Secretary not later than 31st May. Failure to comply may mean that a team will accrue no points thereafter until the list of registered players is submitted.
 - 2.2.1 Any additions to the list of playing members must normally be registered in writing with the Registrations Secretary before they play their first League match. Any transferred player must also comply with the provisions of rules 2.3.1 and 2.3.2.
 - 2.2.2 In exceptional circumstances a player may be registered by 12 noon on the day of his first match by obtaining the verbal permission of the Registrations Secretary, or if he is not available, of any member of the Rules Sub-Committee.
 - 2.2.3 New players may not normally be registered after 1st August. In exceptional circumstances, however, the Registrations Secretary may permit the registration of a player after the closing date.
 - 2.2.4 Registrations made in accordance with Rule 2.2.2 or 2.2.3 must be confirmed in writing to the Registrations Secretary within 5 days of the match being played.
 - 2.2.5 The 3rd and 4th teams of clubs whose senior teams play in other Leagues may use players from their 2nd team provided they are registered with the Shropshire Cricket League and Rules. 2.4.1 and 2.4.2 are compiled with.

2.3 Transfers

- 2.3.1 Any club wishing to transfer a player from another club, whether it be a member club of the Shropshire Cricket League or another League, must obtain the consent of the Registrations Secretary before he becomes eligible to play for his new club.
 - The player's new club shall complete an official Transfer Form, obtainable from the League Secretary, and shall forward the completed form, together with a letter from the player's previous club confirming that he has fulfilled his obligations to that club, to the Registrations Secretary, he may not play in a League match for his new club until permission has been granted.
- 2.3.2 No transfers will be permitted after 1st August unless exceptional circumstances apply.

2.4 Eligibility

- 2.4.1 A player who has played in 12 or more first team matches during the season shall not be allowed to play in any of the last three matches in a lower division without the approval of the Rules Sub-Committee.
- 2.4.2 A player who has played in a total of 12 or more first/second team matches during the season shall not be allowed to play in any of the last three matches in a lower division without the approval of the Rules Sub-Committee.

RULES FOR THE CONDUCT OF ALL MATCHES

- A fixture list shall be issued by the League Fixtures Secretary and all matches shall take place on the appointed Saturday.
 - shall take place on the appointed Saturday.

 3.1.1 If a club wishes to play a match on a different date from the one published in the official fixture list both clubs must give written notice to the League Secretary not less than ten days before either the date shown in the official fixture list or the re-arranged date, whichever occurs first, and must obtain his permission before playing the match. Any infringement of this rule will result in the match being declared void.

 3.1.2 No player shall take part in more than one match published in the official fixture list to be played on the same day, this condition shall apply also when one or more of those matches has been re-arranged in accordance with Rule 3.1.1.
- 3.2 Matches shall be played in accordance with the Laws of Cricket (2000 Code) with the following provisos:

 - No underarm bowling shall be allowed in the League; Penalty runs (defined in Law 42) will not be awarded, except those accruing from:
 - No balls;
 - Wides:
 - Ball striking protective helmet belonging to the fielding side whilst it is on the ground within the field of play (Law 41.3);
- it is on the ground within the field of play (Law 41.3);

 Unfair fielding of the ball (Law 41.2).

 3.3 The Management Committee shall have the powers to declare a match void if it deems it necessary and may award or deduct points at its discretion.

 3.4 Any club which intends to call off a match for reasons other than provided for in Rule 10 shall cancel its 2nd team game in preference to that of its 1st team; and similarly with the the 3rd and 4th teams of clubs whose senior teams play in other Leagues. (See also Rule 15.2.)

 3.5 All clubs shall be responsible for the behaviour of their supporters at matches. Any inappropriate behaviour will be subject to investigation by the League and any necessary action will be taken against the offending club by the Discipline Sub-Committee.

HOURS AND CONDITIONS OF PLAY

- All matches up to and including the second Saturday in August shall commence at 2.00 p.m. All matches played on or after the third Saturday in August shall commence at 1.00 p.m.
- August shall commence at 1.00 p.m. Prompt starts are essential and the toss for innings shall take place at least fifteen minutes before the scheduled starting time. In the event of a team not being able to comply, the opposing team may, if it so wishes, exercise the right to claim the toss. Clubs who arrive late without satisfactory explanation will be dealt with by the Management Committee, who may deduct points from the record of the offending club.

 A match shall normally consist of 100 overs; however, the captains may agree to reduce the number of overs if, in their opinion, weather conditions so indicate. The minimum number of overs to constitute a match shall be 80.

- The side batting first may receive a maximum of half of the allotted overs.

 The side batting first may receive a maximum of half of the allotted overs.

 The side batting second shall utilise the balance of the overs not used by the side batting first. For this purpose the last over of the first innings shall be counted as a completed over.

 In conjunction with the scorers, the umpires shall ensure that the recording of overs and runs is correctly made and adequately displayed at the end of each over.
- each over.
- Before the first ball of the last over of each innings, the umpires shall call "last over" clearly so that both sides understand.
- Immediately upon the conclusion of each innings the scorers and umpires shall agree the accuracy of the recorded scores. The umpires' decision shall be final. No match shall start later than 3 hours after the official starting time.

4.10 In all Divisions, teams must use at least four bowlers in their allotted overs, four of whom must bowl a minimum of four overs each. No bowler may bowl more than 20 overs.

INTERRUPTION OF PLAY
5.1 In the event of interference by weather, light or other unforeseen circumstances amounting to 30 minutes or more after the scheduled starting time, play shall cease at 8.30 p.m. (7.30 p.m. on or after the third Saturday in August) or on the completion of the final 20 overs, or on the completion of the number of overs that constitute that particular match, with the final 20 overs, as per the Laws of Cricket, commencing at 7.30 p.m. (6.30 p.m. on or after the third Saturday in August).
5.2 If an interruption of play occurs during the final 20 overs, the number of overs will be reduced by one over for every full three minutes lost and if the reduced number of overs is completed before 8.30 p.m. (7.30 p.m. on or after the third Saturday in August), and unless the number of overs constitutes the conclusion of the particular match, play will continue until 8.30 p.m. (7.30 p.m. on or after the third Saturday in August), or until the completion of the number of overs calculated to be bowled in the last hour, whichever shall be the later.
5.3 If the teams are off the field of play at the scheduled closing times detailed above, play shall be abandoned.
5.4 If the side batting second do not receive as many overs as the side batting

5.4 If the side batting second do not receive as many overs as the side batting first then the game shall be deemed to be "abandoned".

ALLOCATION OF POINTS

A maximum of 20 points are available per side, 10 of which are bonus points: 5 batting, 5 bowling.

Bowling bowns points: 1 point for every 2 wickets taken (2, 4, 6, 8 and after that, last wicket).

Batting bonus points: 1 point for reaching 100, 125, 150, 175, up to a maximum of 5 points on reaching 200 runs.

Win: 20 points awarded (includes maximum bonus points).

Lose: Bonus points only.

Draw:

Bonus points only.

Bonus points for both sides, plus 10 points divided between the teams, as follows (points for side batting first are shown first):
5-5 if the scores are tied;
6-4 if 90% or more of the first innings total is scored;
7-3 if 80% or more of the first innings total is scored;
8-2 if 70% or more of the first innings total is scored;
9-1 if 60% or more of the first innings total is scored;
10-0 if less than 60% of the first innings total is scored.

Abandoned: Three points to each side plus bonus points.

Not Started: Three points to each side

Not Started: Three points to each side. In the event of a declaration only wickets taken qualify for bowling bonus points. When calculating bowling bonus points, the wicket of a batsman who has "Retired, Not Out" (as defined in Law 2.9) has not fallen.

In all Divisions, two new balls, specified by and purchased through the League, shall be used in each game. Each team shall provide one ball.

If a ball is lost it shall be the responsibility of the fielding side to provide a suitable

The cost of League balls shall be notified to member clubs and payment shall be made to the Treasurer by the due date. (See also Rule 15.3.)

UMPIRES AND SCORERS

Teams shall endeavour to provide an umpire and a scorer in all League games.

8.2 If one side provides an umpire and the other does not, that one umpire shall be the official umpire for the match and shall stand at the bowler's end throughout the match.

8.3 Umpires are encouraged to comment to the League Secretary on the co-operation of teams and captains.

9. PITCHES

9.1 Matches will normally be played on grass pitches. In exceptional circumstances the League may consent to a team playing all its home matches on an artificial pitch.

9.2 A match may be played on an artificial pitch, by agreement between the captains, when conditions would otherwise prevent the game being played.

9.3 Before the toss is made, the home captain should advise his opposite number whether covers are available.

10. CANCELLATION OF MATCHES

In the event of any ground being unfit for play owing to weather or other circumstances it shall be the responsibility of the home club to inform the visiting club of this fact. (See also Rule 3.4.)

This should be carried out on the day of the match **not before 11.00** a.m., and **not later than 12.00 noon** (10.00 a.m. and 11.00 a.m. from the third Saturday in August).

11. NOTIFICATION OF RESULTS

11.1 It shall be the responsibility of the home club to complete an official League Score Sheet. The Score Sheet shall contain full details of the game, including the names of ALL players, and shall be signed by both captains and, where appropriate, the umpires.

11.2 The Score Sheet must be posted (by First Class Post) to the League Secretary before the last collection time on the Monday following the match. Alternatively the Score Sheet may be faxed not later than 12 noon on the Tuesday following the match. Failure to comply with this Rule will result in points being deducted from the offending club.

Notes: 1 Clubs should make every effort to notify the result of their game to the media in time for publication.

media in time for publication.

2 Captains should ensure that players are consistently and uniquely listed on the Score Sheet; this is to assist the League in correctly identifying players for its records.

3 Even though a match is abandoned without a ball being bowled the home team must still send a Score Sheet to the League Secretary.

12.1 Any protest shall be lodged with the League Secretary by the Club Secretary (or other authorised club official) in writing within four days following the match.

12.2 A copy of such protest shall be sent to the club against whom the protest is

12.3 Each protest is to be accompanied by a fee of £10 which shall be forfeited if the Disputes Sub-Committee deems the protest to be trivial.

12.4 The club sustaining the protest or objection may have points added to its total points gained, but such points shall not exceed the maximum for a win. (See also Rule 3.3.)

12.5 When making a protest clubs shall state under which rule the protest is

being made.

12.6 Clubs or players who are the subject of protests or disputes may be required to attend the hearing of that protest or dispute.

12.7 Any fine exceeding £20, any ban exceeding two weeks or any award or deduction of points exceeding 20, must first be endorsed by the Management Committee.

12.8 Any protest which arises from interpretation of the Laws of Cricket shall be referred to the appropriate national body for settlement and their decision shall be final; in all other matters the decision of the League shall be final.

13. APPEALS

- 13.1 A club may appeal against any decision of the Disputes Sub-Committee; such appeal will be heard by the Appeals Sub-Committee as constituted by the Management Committee.
- Any appeal shall be lodged with the League Secretary by the Club Secretary (or other authorised club official) in writing within 14 days of the Disputes Sub-Committee's decision being notified to them.

- Sub-Committee's decision being notified to them.

 13.3 A copy of the appeal shall be sent to any other club involved in the protest.

 13.4 The appeal shall be accompanied by a fee of £20 as a contribution towards the costs of hearing the appeal. The Appeals Sub-Committee may at its discretion retain or refund all or part of the fee.

 13.5 The appeal must include a full statement explaining why it is being lodged.

 13.6 The club will be permitted to have two representatives to present its case at the hearing, the Appeals Sub-Committee may require clubs/officials to attend the hearing.

 13.7 The Appeals Sub-Committee is empowered to over-rule the decision of the Disputes Sub-Committee. Any fine exceeding, £20, any ban exceeding two weeks or any award or deduction of points exceeding 20, must first be endorsed by the Management Committee.

14. LEAGUE POSITIONAL PLACINGS

In the event of two or more teams finishing the season on the same number of points, the following criteria shall be applied successively to determine final placings:

- nts, the following criteria shall be applied successively to determine final placings: The highest number of wins; The lowest number of defeats; The number of points gained by the teams in matches played between them during the season; The highest number of wickets taken in the season and; The highest number of runs scored in the season.

15. FINES AND SURCHARGES

- Any club which has not paid its subscription by the due date (see Rule 1) shall be liable to a surcharge of £5 per team for every month or part of a month that it is in arrears.

- It is in arrears.

 15.2 Any club which fails to fulfil a League fixture shall be fined £10 for each offence.

 15.3 Any club which has not paid for its allocation of League balls by the due date (see Rule 7) shall be liable to a surcharge of £10 per team.

 15.4 Any club which does not return a trophy when requested will be fined. If any trophy is found to be damaged or requires cleaning when returned, the offending club will be invoiced with the cost of the renovation work.

 15.5 If a club fails to pay any fine or surcharge within 14 days of the due date, points will also be deducted.

DANGEROUS AND UNFAIR BOWLING (LAW 42)

The Laws of Cricket (2000 Code) have re-defined Dangerous and Unfair Bowling and amended the penalties.

Law 42.6 (a) – Bowling of fast short pitched balls.

- Law 42.6 (a) Bowling of fast short pitched balls.
 The bowling of fast short pitched balls is dangerous and unfair if the umpire at the bowlers end considers that by their repetition and taking into account their length, height and direction they are likely to inflict physical injury on the striker, irrespective of the protective equipment he may be wearing. The relative skill and age of the striker shall also be taken into consideration.
 Any delivery which, after pitching, passes or would have passed above head height of the striker standing upright at the crease, although not threatening physical injury, is deemed to be unfair and the umpire shall call and signal "No Ball".
 Any delivery, other than a slow paced one, which passes or would have passed on the full above waist height of the striker standing upright at the crease is dangerous and unfair, whether or not it is likely to inflict physical injury on the striker.

A slow delivery which passes or would have passed on the full above shoulder height of the striker standing upright at the crease is dangerous and unfair, whether or not it is likely to inflict physical injury on the striker.
 Law 42.7 - Dangerous and unfair bowling - action by the umpire.
 In the event of Dangerous and/or Unfair Bowling, the umpire shall call and signal "No Ball" and issue a caution to the bowler and the captain.
 In the event of repetition, the umpire shall additionally inform the bowler that this is a final warning.
 In the event of further repetition, the umpire shall additionally instruct the captain to take off the bowler forthwith, the over being completed by another player. The bowler shall not bowl again in that match and the umpire shall report the incident to the League Secretary.
 Law 42.8 - Deliberate bowling of high full pitched balls.
 If the umpire considers that a high full pitched ball was bowled deliberately, he shall call and signal "No Ball" and shall instruct the captain to take the bowler off forthwith, i.e. without going through the procedure of issuing warnings, etc. (as in Law 42.7). The bowler shall not bowl again in that match and the umpire shall report the incident to the League Secretary.
 Law 25 - Wide Ball.
 It should be noted that a ball which passes "so high over the wicket that, in the opinion of the umpire, it passes out of reach of the striker" will no longer be a "Wide". It will be called and signalled "No Ball" and Law 42.7 (or 42.8) will apply.

SAFETY GUIDANCE ON THE WEARING OF CRICKET HELMETS BY YOUNG PLAYERS

The England and Wales Cricket Board's safety guidlines on the wearing of cricket helmets by young players are as follows:

- Ine EDGIand and Wales Cricket Board's safety guidlines on the wearing of cricket helmets by young players are as follows:

 It is recommended that a helmet is worn by young players when batting and when standing up to the stumps when keeping wicket against a hard cricket ball in matches and in practice.

 A young player should not be allowed to bat or to stand up to the stumps when keeping wicket without a helmet against a hard ball except with written parental consent. Coaches, teachers, managers and umpires should always ensure that a young player wears a helmet if this written parental consent has not been received.

 Players should regard a helmet with a faceguard as a normal item of protective equipment when batting against a hard ball, together with pads, gloves and, for boys, an abdominal protector (box).

 There is a British Standard (857928:1998) for cricket helmets and it is in the best interests of players to ensure that their helmet conforms to this standard.

 The ECB is recommending that this guidance is followed by all players up to the age of 18. It applies to young players in adult cricket as well as to all junior cricket played with a hard cricket ball.

 The ECB is requesting that the new guidance is communicated to the parents or guardians of all young players though clubs and schools, and that parental consent is always obtained before young players are allowed to bat or stand up to the stumps when keeping wicket against a hard ball without wearing a helmet.

 No young player in the Under 15 age group or younger shall be allowed to field closer than 8 yards (7.3 metres) from the middle stump, except behind the wicket on the off side, until the batsman has played at the ball.

- batsman has played at the ball.

 For players in the Under 13 age group and below the distance is 11 yards (10 metres).

 These minimum distances apply even if the player is wearing a helmet.

 Should a young player in these age groups come within the restricted distance the umpire must stop the game immediately and instruct the fielder to move back.

 In addition any young player in the Under 16 to Under 18 age groups, who has not reached the age of 18, must wear a helmet and, for boys, an abdominal protector (box) when fielding within 6 yards (5.5 metres) of the bat, except behind the wicket on the off side. Players should wear appropriate protective equipment whenever they are fielding in a position where they feel at risk.

 These fielding regulations are applicable to all cricket in England and Wales. Age groups are based on the age of the player at midnight on 31st August in the year preceding the current season.

For the purpose of these Directives a fast bowler should be defined as a bowler to whom a wicket keeper in the same age group would **in normal circumstances** stand back to take the ball.

back to take the ball.

Having completed a spell the bowler cannot bowl again, from either end, until the equivalent number of overs to the length of his* spell have been bowled from the same end. A bowler can change ends without ending his current spell provided that he bowls the next over that he legally can from the other end. If this does not happen his spell is deemed to be concluded. If play is interrupted, for any reason, for less than 40 minutes any spell in progress at the time of the interruption can be continued after the interruption up to the maximum number of overs per spell for the appropriate age group. If the spell is not continued after the interruption the bowler cannot bowl again, from either end, until the equivalent number of overs to the length of his spell before the interruption have been bowled from the same end. If the interruption is of 40 minutes or more, whether scheduled or not, the bowler can commence a new spell immediately.

Once a bowler covered by these Directives has bowled in a match be cannot exceed.

Once a bowler covered by these Directives has bowled in a match he cannot exceed the maximum number of overs per day for his age group even if he subsequently bowls spin. He can exceed the maximum overs per spell if bowling spin, but cannot then revert to bowling fast until an equivalent number of overs to the length of his spell have been bowled from the same end. If he bowls spin without exceeding the maximum number of overs in a spell the maximum will apply as soon as he reverts to bowling fast.

Captains, Team Managers and Umpires are asked to ensure that these Directives are followed at all times.



- The League organises two evening 11-a-side knock out competitions to provide additional cricket for players who play regularly for their club in its League matches during the season.
- The Shropshire League Knock-out Cup Competition is for first teams.
- The Shropshire League Knock-out Shield Competition is for reserve teams including the third/fourth teams of clubs whose senior teams play in other Leagues.
- Entry to the competitions is by invitation from the Management Committee.
- Clubs without reserve teams are not eligible to enter the **Shield Competition**.

ORGANISATION

- Teams will be drawn before the season starts and the fixtures will be published in the League's Handbook.
- Teams will be notified by the League Secretary who their opponent will be as the competition progresses.

 Matches must be played in accordance with these rules and results must be sent promptly to the League Secretary.

 The competitions are organised and run by the Knock-out-Competitions Sub-Committee.

ELIGIBILITY OF PLAYERS

- All players must be bona fide members of the club for which they play in the Competition and must be registered with the League in accordance with Rule 2 of the League's "Rules and Playing Arrangements". To qualify to play in the Second and later rounds of the Cup Competition, all players must have taken part in at least 20% of their club's Shropshire Cricket League matches played before that round. To qualify to play in the Second and later rounds of the Shield Competition, all players must have taken part in at least 20% of their reserve team's Shropshire Cricket League matches played before that round.
 - When determining a player's eligibility, a League match which was not started does not count as a "match played".
- A player is not permitted to take part in both the *Cup Competition* and the *Shield Competition* in the same season.
- A player is not permitted to play for more than one club in the Competition.
- No player may take part in the Competitions if he plays in another League on Saturdays. Subject, however, to Rules 3.1 and 3.2 being compiled with, this Rule is waived in the *Shield Competition* for reserve team players whose senior teams play in other Leagues.
- PROVIDED application is made to the Chairman of the Knock-out Competition Sub-Committee NOT LESS THAN FIVE DAYS BEFORE the match is due to be played, explaining the reasons for the request, the Sub-Committee may be prepared to consider a relaxation of Rule 3.2 and 3.3 when a club:-
 - (a) is genuinely unable to raise a full team of eligible players for a particular match; or
 - wishes to include a player who is unable to play for his club on Saturdays provided he does not play cricket in any other League on Saturdays (see Rule 3.4).
- Any club using an ineligible player will be expelled from the competition and may be debarred from entry in subsequent years.

MATCH ARRANGEMENTS

- Matches shall be played on the ground chosen by the home side.
- Cup Competition matches shall be played on the Wednesday evening of the specified week unless both clubs agree to play on a different evening of the same week.

- evening or the same week.

 Shield Competition matches shall be played on the any evening of the specified week as mutually agreed between the two clubs.

 It is the responsibility of the home club to contact the visiting team to agree the match arrangements.

 If a club fails to fulfil a fixture without giving at least 48 hours notice to the opposing team it will be expelled from the Competition and the match will be awarded to the opposing team.
- If bad weather prevents a Cup Competition match being played or completed in the specified week, the clubs must re-arrange it to take place the following Wednesday unless both clubs agree to play it on a different evening of that week.
- If bad weather prevents a **Shield Competition** match being played or completed in the specified week, the clubs must re-arrange it to take place no later than the following week.
- No match, other than one re-arranged in accordance with Rule 4.6 or 4.7, shall be played after the specified week.
- If a match is not played by the latest permitted date without good reason both clubs shall be expelled from the competition.
- 4.10 Evening matches shall commence at 6.30 p.m. and prompt starts are essential.
- 4.11 Each team shall have one innings consisting of a maximum of twenty six-ball overs. If there is a late start or if weather conditions make this desirable, the captains may, before the toss takes place, agree to reduce the number of overs.
- 4.12 The toss for innings shall take place not later than 6.20 p.m. In the event of a team not complying with this, the opposing team may, if it so wishes, claim the toss.
- 4.13 If one team is not ready to play by 6.45 p.m. that team shall be deemed to have defaulted and the match shall be awarded to the other team.

 4.14 The match ball shall be provided by the home club, approved by both captains before the toss and used throughout the game. It need not be new but must be of good quality and in good condition.
- 4.15 No bowler may bowl more than one quarter (rounded up to the nearest whole number) of the agreed overs.
- 4.16 The interval between innings shall not exceed ten minutes.
- 4.17 No appeal against the light is allowed after the commencement of the second innings unless the umpires decide that it would be unreasonable or dangerous for play to continue.
- uanyerous for play to continue.

 4.18 A match is won by the side scoring the greater number of runs in the agreed overs. If the scores are level, the team which has lost fewer wickets shall be the winner; if the number of wickets taken is also equal, the team scoring the greater number of runs after half the agreed overs have been bowled shall be the winner. If these also are the same, the winner shall be decided by the toss of a coin.

NOTIFICATION OF RESULT

- 5.1 It shall be the responsibility of the WINNING CLUB to ensure that a fully completed official Shropshire League Knock-out Score Sheet, signed as correct by both captains and umpires, is sent to the League Secretary, to arrive not later than two days after the match was played.
- 5.2 Captains must ensure that the names of all players appear on the Score Sheet.

- 5.3 If the Score Sheet is not received by the League Secretary within the stipulated time or it is incomplete, both clubs may be expelled from the Competition.
- 5.4 The League Secretary will notify winning clubs who they will play in the next round and will send an official Score Sheet to the HOME CLUB'S nominated correspondent.

FINALS

- 6.1 The Cup Competition Final shall be played at a neutral venue on a date determined by the Management Committee.
- 6.2 The Shield Competition Final shall be played on a home and away basis on consecutive evenings at venues chosen by the clubs involved. The dates of the Final shall be determined by the Knock-out Competition Sub-Committee.
- 6.3 The match arrangements for the Shield Competition Final shall be generally in accordance with Rules 4.10, 4.12, 4.16 and 4.17 and Rules 6.4, 6.5, 6.7, 6.8 and 6.9.
- 6.4 The league will provide two new balls of good quality, one for each team's use.
- 6.5 Each team shall have two innings, each consisting of twenty six-ball overs. The captains may, however, agree, before the toss takes place, to reduce the number of overs, if the weather conditions make this desirable.
- 6.6 In the Cup Competition Final the teams' innings shall be taken alternately.
- 6.7 In the Shield Competition Final the team batting first in the first innings shall bat second in the second innings.
- 6.8 No bowler may bowl more than one quarter (rounded up to the nearest whole number) of the agreed overs in an innings.
- 6.9 The winner is the team scoring the greater number of runs. If the scores are level at the end of the match, the team losing fewer wickets shall be declared the winner. If the number of wickets lost is the same, the team scoring the greater number of runs in the first innings shall be the winner. If these are the same, the team losing fewer wickets in the first innings shall be the winner. If these also are the same, the winner shall be decided by the toss of a coin.
- 6.10 The trophy shall be presented to the captain of the winning team. It shall remain the property of the League and shall be returned when requested by the Awards Sub-Committee.
- 6.11 The players of both teams and the umpires will be presented with small trophies as mementoes of the occasion.
- 6.12 The umpires will be invited to nominate, and a trophy will be presented to the *Man of the Match*.

7. UMPIRES

- 7.1 The Knock-out Competition Sub-Committee will appoint umpires for the Semi-Finals of the Cup Competition and for the Finals of the Cup and Shield Competitions. The League will pay them reasonable expenses.
- 7.2 If requested to do so, the Knock-out Competition Sub-Committee will endeavour to appoint umpires for matches in the earlier rounds of the competition. It will, however, be the responsibility of the team(s) making the request to pay the umpires' reasonable expenses.
- 7.3 Umpires are urged to apply a strict and consistent interpretation of Law 25 "Wide Ball", especially to a ball delivered down the leg side and passing wide of the batsman standing in a normal guard position or passing more than 18" (450 mm) outside the off stump.

CONSTITUTION

NAME

The organisation shall be known as The Shropshire Cricket League Sponsored by Banks's, hereafter referred to as "the League".

To promote and develop the best interests of cricket in Shropshire and its bordering counties.

MEMBERSHIP

- The League shall consist of member Clubs who satisfy the requirements of the League and Management Committee, hereafter referred to as "the Committee", with regard to status, playing strength and standard of grounds and facilities. (a)
- All member clubs must be affiliated to their relevant Cricket Board. Failure to do so could result in expulsion from the League.
- The teams of member Clubs shall play in Divisions, as determined by the
- Committee.

 There shall normally be promotion and relegation between Divisions. In exceptional circumstances the Committee may make other arrangements and shall notify all member Clubs of its decision.

 Any club desiring admission to, or any member Club seeking to change the number of its teams in, the League, shall apply in writing to the League Secretary not later than 15th October, indicating the number of teams it wishes to enter next season. Each application shall be considered by the Committee in accordance with the requirements of Clauses 3(a) 3(b) and 3(c) above. In exceptional circumstances, applications received after the closing date may be considered.

 Any member Club wishing to resign from the League shall give notice in
- Any member Club wishing to resign from the League shall give notice in writing to the League Secretary not later than 15th October.

 Clauses 3(e) and 3(f) above shall not apply to any club promoted to or relegated from another recognised League forming part of the English Cricket Board's pyramid structure.
- Cricket Board's pyramid structure.

 A member Club which removes its first team from the League shall be deemed to have resigned its membership: it may, however, apply to re-enter one or more of its lower teams and the application will be considered in accordance with the requirements of Clause 3(e) above.

 The Committee shall have powers to require any member Club to resign from the League if, in its opinion, its general conduct or appointments do not satisfy the requirements of the League. Any member Club against which such action is proposed shall receive not less than 14 days notice in writing of the proposed action and shall be entitled to be represented at that part of the Committee meeting at which the matter is to be considered.

 Any Club which ceases to be a member of the League shall at once forfeit
- Any Club which ceases to be a member of the League shall at once forfeit any rights of participation in the assets of the League.
- Following a recommendation from the Committee, the Annual General Meeting may confer the honour of Life Membership of the League on any person whom it considers worthy of special recognition by reason of services rendered to the League.

MANAGEMENT

Subject to the provisions of this Constitution, the control and management of the League shall be vested in the Management Committee, which shall make rules governing the general principles of the conduct of the League's affairs and shall have the powers to apply, create, alter or revoke such rules as it sees fit. The Committee shall have the power to convene a Special General Meeting of member Clubs. member Clubs

MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

- (a) The Committee shall consist of ex officio the Officers in 6(a) below and fifteen elected Members.
- One-third of the elected Members shall be elected at each Annual General Meeting for a term of three years, after which time they shall retire from the Committee and, if they wish, offer themselves for re-election. Not more than two elected Members from the same Club shall serve on the Committee at the same time.

- Committee at the same time.

 At least seven days notice of meetings shall be given. Accidental omission to give notice of any meeting or non-receipt of such notice by any Committee member shall not invalidate any resolution passed at any such meeting. The Chairman shall preside, at meetings of the Committee. If the Chairman is absent the Vice-Chairman shall preside; if both are absent, the Committee members present shall, before any other business is transacted, choose one of their number to preside at the meeting.

 One-third of the Committee shall form a quorum.
- All questions arising at a Committee meeting, other than questions of order, shall be decided by a simple majority of votes: in the event of an equality of votes, the chairman of the meeting shall have a second or casting vote. Committee members shall "declare an interest" when an issue directly affecting their own club is to be discussed and shall normally abstain from any vote on such matter.
- The Committee may appoint sub-committees with such powers and terms of reference as it thinks fit.
- The Committee shall have power to co-opt to fill a vacancy. Co-opted members shall serve until the next Annual General Meeting when the vacancy shall be filled by election.
- The decision of the Committee is final.
- Committee members are expected to attend all of its meetings. Anyone who fails to attend three or more consecutive meetings is liable to expulsion
- (m) Any Committee member whose club ceases to be a member of the League may be required, at the discretion of the Committee, to resign his position.

OFFICERS

- (a)
- The Officers of the League shall be the President, Chairman, Vice-Chairman, League Secretary, Treasurer, Fixtures Secretary and Registrations Secretary. The Officers shall be elected annually at, and shall take office from the end of, the Annual General Meeting.

FINANCE

- Each member Club shall pay to the Treasurer, not later than the end of April, an annual subscription for each team. Any club which fails to pay by the due date may be charged an additional penalty for each month or part of a month that it is in arrears. The amounts of the subscription and the penalty will be determined each year by the Committee and notified to all member Clubs. (a)
- If the subscription income is found to be insufficient to meet the League's needs, the Committee may levy an additional subscription on member
- The Committee shall cause proper account to be kept of all sums of money received and paid out by the League.

 The financial year of the League shall end on 31st October.
- The accounts of the League shall be examined annually by a qualified accountant, who shall certify their correctness.
- A statement of accounts shall be presented by the Treasurer to the Annual General Meeting.

The funds of the League shall be invested as the Committee decides after considering the recommendations of the Treasurer and the day-to-day transactions shall be dealt with by and through one or more Bank accounts in the name of the League.

No moneys shall be paid from any account in the name of the League except upon the signatures of any two from the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, League Secretary and Treasurer who shall be the authorised signatories.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

INUAL GENERAL MEETING

The Annual General Meeting, hereafter referred to as "the Meeting", shall be held in November each year or as practicable thereafter.

Notice of the Meeting shall be given in writing to all member Clubs at least twenty-eight days before the date thereof.

The President shall preside at the Meeting. If the President is absent the Chairman shall preside; if the Chairman is absent the Vice-Chairman shall preside; if all are absent, the member Clubs present shall, before any other business is transacted, appoint a chairman of the Meeting.

Nominations for President, Chairman, Vice-Chairman, League Secretary, Treasurer, Fixtures Secretary, Registrations Secretary and elected Members of the Committee shall be submitted in writing by member Clubs and received by the League Secretary at least seven days before the Meeting.

Each member Club shall have one vote. In the event of an equality of votes, the chairman of the Meeting shall have a single casting vote.

the chairman of the Meeting shall have a single casting vote.

Proxy votes will not be accepted.

The Constitution may be altered at an Annual General Meeting or Special General Meeting only and such alteration shall require the assent of at least two-thirds of the votes cast.

Proposals to alter the Constitution must either be submitted by the Committee or be proposed and seconded by at least two member Clubs and received by the League Secretary not later than 30th September. The wording of any such proposed alteration to the Constitution shall be included in the Notice of Meeting.

One-third of the member Clubs shall form a quorum.

SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING

A Special General Meeting shall be called at the discretion of the Committee or on receipt by the League Secretary of a written request, signed by not less than one-third of member Clubs, stating the reason(s) why the meeting is being requested.

The provisions applicable to the Annual General Meeting shall, with the exception of 8(a) and 8(h) above, apply also to the Special General Meeting. Proposals to alter the Constitution must either be submitted by the Committee or be proposed and seconded by at least two member Clubs and submitted to the League Secretary. The wording of any such proposed alteration to the Constitution shall be included in the Notice of Meeting.

Trophies will be awarded to the Champions and Runners-up in all Divisions.

Additional awards may be made at the Committee's discretion.

Trophies remain the property of the League and must be returned in good condition to the League Secretary not later than 30th September. Any member Club failing to do so may be invoiced for the cost of a replacement.

11. FIXTURES

All League matches shall be played on the published dates

Any Club which fails to fulfil a fixture shall be fined on a sliding scale for a first and second offence and is liable to be expelled from the League for a third offence in any one season. The amount of the fines shall be determined from time to time by the Committee and member Clubs shall be notified.

Member Clubs will be informed of the dates on which a League Representa-tive XI may be taking part in a Competition. Clubs should not under any circumstances withdraw a player selected to represent the League in favour of a Club competition.

12. WINDING UP

The League may be wound up only by the passing of a resolution by a majority of at least two-thirds of the member Clubs present and voting at a Special General Meeting convened for the purpose of considering such resolution. resolution.

In the event of the passing of a resolution to wind up the League, the meeting at which such resolution is passed shall appoint a committee which shall be empowered to distribute the League's assets, including cash and investments, between member Clubs, or other organisations having similar aims and objects as the League, in such proportions as they may, by simple majority, decide, provided that the same shall not be paid to, or divided between, any individual members of the Committee or the Officers. The Chairman, League Secretary and Treasurer shall be *ex officio* members of that committee. In the event of an equality of votes the Chairman shall have lost the distribution of the assets, the Chairman shall have power to refer the matter to an independent arbitrator, the costs, if any, of such arbitration being a proper charge on the assets of the League.
